

HOLOCAUST SURVIVORS COMPENSATION PROGRAM



The Conference on Jewish Material Claims Against Germany (Claims Conference) distributes hundreds of millions of dollars annually in direct payments from Germany to tens of thousands of Holocaust victims in 80 countries and territories. The JFCS Holocaust Survivors Program provides case management, financial assistance and support services to local Holocaust Survivors with funding from the Claims Conference.

The current compensation programs of the Claims Conference include:

- Article 2 Fund
- Central and Eastern European Fund
- Hardship Fund
- Child Survivor Fund

A recent negotiation by the Claims Conference made it possible for Holocaust Survivors of Iasi, Romania Death Trains, Pogrom & Ghetto to receive first-ever compensation pensions.

There are also programs administered by the German Government (not Claims Conference) that include:

- Payments to Aid Austrian Survivors
- Compensation for Jewish Victims of Nazi Persecution from Algeria
- Romanian Emergency Assistance Fund
- Czech Benefits for Survivors

If you are a Holocaust Survivor and have never filed an application with the Claims Conference for any compensation programs, we suggest you to do so. Prior registration with Claims Conference will expedite the process of accessing services as a Holocaust Survivor in the future, if needed.
